# National Meet

## Tractor and Agricultural Machinery Manufacturers TAMM-2013

(January 19-20, 2013)

### Background

A fast growing metropolis, the garden city of Bangalore is the capital of the southern Indian state of Karnataka. Situated at about 1000 meters above sea level, it is known for its salubrious climate where temperatures remain moderate through out the year. The maximum temperature in **July** is around 32<sup>0</sup>C and the minimum around 22<sup>0</sup>C. It is connected by air, rail and road to all major cities of the country and has direct international connections to many cities worldwide.

The clean and spacious city of Bangalore has many imposing structures full of historic and modern architecture. The majestic Vidhana Soudha, a magnificent post-independence structure housing the State legislature and Secretariat, stands in the center of the city with its attractive dome and galleries. It is sheer delight to see the illuminated Soudha during nights on Sundays and Holidays. The city has several institutions of Learning and Research. Many of them such as the Indian Institute of Science, Raman Research Institute, National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro-Sciences, National Aerospace Laboratories, Bangalore University have worldwide acclaim. The high-tech industries such as Aerospace, Electronics, Computers and now fast spreading software have made Bangalore their home due to easy access to a vast pool of scientists and engineers in the city. In the area of art and culture too, the city boasts of a rich heritage and tradition and has several schools of classical music and dance.

The city abounds in picturesque parks and gardens and other scenic spots. The extensive stretch of green land of Cubbon Park and the enchanting botanical gardens with Glass-House of Lal-Bagh, both situated right in the middle of the metropolis, lend all the charming grandeur to the city. About 20 m from the city is situated the Bannerghatta National Park. It is a dry deciduous forest which has abundant variety of trees like Neem, Sandal, Tamarind, Jalari. This park is inhabited by the Asian Elephants, leopards, Sloth Bears, Chital, Sambar, Monitor Lizards, Pangolin, Vipers, Cobras, Macaques, Porcupines, Mongoose, etc and lot of bird species are also to be found in this park. Moreover the best time to visit the park is between September and October.

Bangalore boasts of some of the oldest and most beautiful temples in the country. The Venkataramanaswamy Temple is a 300 year old temple. Another impressive temple is the Gavi Gangadhareswara temple, an unusual cave temple. It has been designed in such a manner so that the rays of the sun pass between the horns of a Nandi Bull placed outside the temple, and thereby, illuminate the image of Lord Shiva and newly added ISKON temple.

The Palace city Mysore is just 139 km by road from the city. It was the capital city of Hyder Ali, Tipu Sultan and the entire Wodeyar clan. Mysore's prime attractions are the Mysore Palace, the Chamundi Hills, the famous Brindavan Gardens, the Jayachamarajendra Art Gallery which is located in the Jagannathan Palace, the Mysore Zoo and St. Philomena's Church. About 15 km from

Mysore is the old capital of Tipu Sultan, Srirangapatna. Its fort bears witness to the Tiger of Mysore's last battle against the British. Near Srirangapatna is the world famous Ranganathittu Bird Sanctuary.

### **About University of Agricultural Sciences, Bangalore**

The University of Agricultural Sciences, Bangalore was established through an Act (No. 22) by the then Mysore government in 1963. Although the university came into existence on August 21 1964, a journey into the broad-lands of history reveals it to be a much older institution. It would perhaps not be an exaggeration to say that the university was conceived way back in 1899 in the form of an experimental farm of 30 acres. Following this, an agricultural school was established in 1913 and the farm itself occupied 202 acres. In fact today this very farm constitutes the Main Research Station of the university. Such were the humble beginnings that the university, as it stands today, is a tribute to the visionaries who founded it and those who nurtured it over the past several decades. The main campus GKVK spread around 1300 acres located 15 km north of both railway and bus stations having administrative block, Colleges, Hostels, research plots and other facilities called lungs of north Bangalore.

### **Objective**

The main objectives of the National Meet of Tractor and Agricultural Machinery Manufacturers during **January 19-20, 2013** are:

- 1) Farm Machinery Industries: Status and Future Prospects
  - (a) Tractor, Power Tiller, Combine harvesters, Threshers and other farm equipment
- 2) Problems faced by the Farm Machinery Industries: Issues and Policies
  - (a) Testing of farm machinery and standards
  - (b) Financing, Credit policy and Subsidy on farm equipment;
  - (c) Export of farm machinery
  - (d) Other issues
- 3) Visit to Farm Machinery Fairs abroad
- 4) Partnership with ICAR/SAUs for manufacturing of new machines

### **Technical Presentations**

There will be technical presentations by executives of the tractor and allied machinery manufacturers, personnel from DOAC, BIS, Bankers and others working in the field.

### **Registration**
